HUNGARIAN SUMMER CAMP FOR YOUNG PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

BALATONFENYVES - AUGUST 25 - 30, 2026

HAND IN HAND

Most people with disabilities never recover, and often encounter only pity and uncertainty from their environment. However, pity alone does not provide a solution. **People with disabilities expect what we all do: genuine relationships and acceptance.** Yet in everyday life, invisible walls separate them from society, leading to isolation - not only for them, but also for their family members and loved ones. Raising and caring for a child with disabilities places an enormous burden on their relatives.

The Hungarian Maltese Charity Service facilitates the daily lives of people with disabilities in its institutions, and also considers helping to promote these people's integration and acceptance into society part of the Charity Service's mission.

CAMP FOR PEOPLE WITH MOBILITY DISABILITIES

An effective method of integration is a joint summer camp that includes both young people with disabilities and volunteers of similar age. **The distinctive feature of the Hungarian Maltese Charity Service camp is that 100 young people with mobility disabilities arrive for the week-long vacation without their family members and permanent caregivers. During the camp, they are assisted by peer volunteers who have been prepared in advance for the task.** All young people participate together in the programs while getting to know and better understand one another. People with mobility disabilities gain reinforcement and self-confidence, while their companions can also dispel myths and prejudices about people with disabilities within their families and circle of acquaintances. In the camp, the invisible walls erected by pity and ignorance are broken down from both sides. Here young people with mobility limitations can participate in programs that would not be possible, or would be very difficult to implement in a family environment. The accessible Lake Balaton shoreline and a safe pier specifically designed for this week await the campers, and the week's program also includes sailing boat excursions, competitions, activities offering physical and spiritual renewal, and evening disco.

Incredible things have happened thanks to previous camps. Marriages were formed, and a multitude of people experienced tremendous transformation.
